Dear Mr. Voorhees:

Video evidence provided to WDW's Poaching Enforcement Division by a confidential informant indicates a potential connection between Pinedale, Wyoming resident Bill Bouchard and Wonder Glen, Inc.

On November 2, 2008, Mr. Bouchard accosted a pair of un-permitted campers on Wyoming state land (Drayback Ridge; coordinates: 4°46'23"N 111°00'09"W) at which time Mr. Bouchard allegedly committed First Degree Taking of Animals that Resulted in the Loss of a Wildlife Resources, to wit, one female bald eagle and one female American Black Bear (unpermitted; off-season), rendering a "negative two" data entry in the State's Q308 wildlife population census.

Mr. Bouchard also allegedly committed wasteful Taking of Game or Fish by Allowing Meat to go to Waste, Use of an Assault Rifle on a Raptor, as well as Wanton or Negligent Discharge of a Service-issued Rifle Under Color of Law.

Mr. Bouchard is also being investigated for impersonating a game warden, forging Wyoming State Insignia, and Constructing an Ersatz Warden Vehicle with the Intent to Deceive.

He will face criminal charges, a prison term, and fines up to \$10,000. The carcasses have been forfeited to the Wyoming Wildlife Drive-Through Taxidermy Museum, and Mr. Bouchard has been stripped of hunting and fishing privileges for a term of 6 years.

While we do not have sufficient evidence at this time to pursue action against Wonder Glen, we are placing your company on a WDW watch list. You have 21 days to contest this determination by mail.

Please consult the "Stop Poaching" informational flier attached herewith. We hope that Wonder Glen, Inc. will join the WDW in its fight against this destructive and senseless practice.
